About Aberdour Golf Club

Six miles southeast of Dunfermline is Aberdour Golf Club, located in a charming region of the Kingdom of Fife. The course has two sets of tees, playing 5,460 yards from the back and 4,840 from the forward tees. This parkland layout unusually starts out with back-to-back par-3s, both playing 159 yards. From there, holes No. 3-6 are par 4s all under 370 yards. Short iron and wedge play is crucial at Aberdour, but here these clubs may be tricky to control. Wind can at times be severe, making any lofted club more difficult to control. There are great views over the River Forth to Edinburgh and the Pentlands Hills. The course follows the seashore and moves inland with more parkland features.

About Anstruther Golf Club

Anstruther Golf Club was founded in 1890 and has seen many changes over the years. The initial layout comprised 7 holes with trenches through the middle of the course and poles scattered over the greens to stop gliders landing during the war. In more peaceful times the course was extended to an excellent 9 holes which is kept in superb condition throughout the year.

The course is located 9 miles south of St Andrews and stretches along the shoreline between Anstruther and Pittenweem. The spectacular views over Anstruther Harbour and out to the Isle of May, Bass rock and south west to Edinburgh are a constant distraction. Golfers should beware of Anstruther Golf Club's version of Amen corner which comprises a series of 3 challenging par 3's starting with The Rockies (5th) voted the toughest par 3 in the UK

About Arbroath Golf Club

The golf course of Arbroath's Artisans' Golf Club is a typical links course, quite flat with subtle undulations for its entire length. Seven holes go straight out on the inside of the course, three cut back and the rest follow the main East Coast railway line separating the fairways from the beach. It is also a very open golf course, with any wind coming off the water or from the west influencing play considerably.

The 7th heralds a fine run of holes marked by good bunkering and well-contoured, plateau greens. The most challenging holes on the course are found on the back nine with the 12th and 13th particularly good par fours. The 14th is a 239-yard, par three that is well-bunkered with a burn beyond the green, and it can cause problems.

About Balcomie Golf Club

A combination of stunning coastal views, centuries of history and hugely enjoyable golf is what makes Balcomie Links one of Scotland's most finely polished, golfing gems.

This traditional, classic links course was laid out by the old master himself, Tom Morris, and opened in 1895. Created in the days when course design was governed by the natural lie of the land and not the mechanical earth mover, Balcomie has the unusual combination of three par 5's, six par 3's and nine par 4's, producing a tough par of 69. Extraordinary holes abound, along with those which seriously challenge and those which are more comfortable. The sum total is a layout which both enchants and delights, but which also demands and punishes, testing all the skills in a golfer's armoury – as well as his nerve. Those length seekers who believe Balcomie will be a soft touch, do so at their peril.

The Bruce remains a thoroughly enjoyable test of golf. Undulating greens, streams, ponds and enticing tree-lined fairways provide a challenging activity to both low and high handicap golfers alike.

There are not many courses where the outward nine holes is Par 39 including a sequence of no less than four Par 5s in six holes - punctuated by the infamous pond hole - the 6th. Many of the fairways are bounded by trees and plantations, a mixture of mature cherries, oaks, beech, ash, pine, larch and spruce offering fantastic views of the surrounding countryside.

About Craighead Golf Club

This challenging, cliff-top course was designed by world-renowned, golf course architect Gil Hanse to provide golfing aficionados with a true test of their shot making skills in a links environment. Built in the style of a traditional links course - with no trees protecting golf shots from the wind - Craighead provides panoramic views of up to 100 miles, legally protected Sites of Special Scientific Interest flanking the 13th and 14th holes, and a World War I pill box behind the 7th green, all in addition to serious golf.

Four sets of tees – red, blue, yellow and white – provide lengths between 5,340 and 6,722 yards, and pars of 74 (red), 69 (blue) and 72 (yellow and white). With no two consecutive holes facing in the same direction, managing the wind is a significant factor in playing the course. A real puzzler arrives early in the shape of the 2nd hole, a right angle 364 yard dogleg with a wickedly sloping green and deep bunker. This hole played the hardest in the international tournaments held on the course.

Located 20 minutes from the Old Course at St. Andrews is Leven Links Golf Club. The history is rich, staking claim as the 11th-oldest golf club in the world. The course is challenging - enough to be a qualifying course for the British Open. It plays longer than 6,400 yards from the championship tees with the longest hole, the par-5 sixth, at 567 yards. Visitors are welcome any time other than Saturdays. The club expanded to 18 holes in 1868 and retained its layout until 1909 when part of the grounds were taken over by a football and bowling ground. The course is still historic. The last hole, "Home Green," remains intact, despite a new green that replaced the old, small square one. The green is still fronted by "Scennie Burn." It's one of the finest classic finishing holes in Fife.

Dunfermline Pitreavie Golf Club was built by renowned architect Alistair Mackenzie. This parkland course and has undulating fairways and beautiful panoramic views of the Forth Valley, including Forth rail and road Bridges. Greens here are some of the finest in Fife and most often have two and even three tiers, making four-putts very possible. The club originally opened in 1922, about a decade prior to Mackenzie's construction of Augusta National.

The club is long for an older Scottish course, playing slightly more than 6,000 yards. The first hole is daunting, a 470-yard par 4, but that's as long as the par 4s get. The ninth plays just 277 yards, but over a deep gorge.

This hole is the first of a very challenging final five holes, which are shorter than most on the course but are very tricky. From there, "Huttons Gap," is a tricky 348-yard par 4, followed by two short par 4s that play 220 and 260 yards, respectively. Brains outwit brawn, however, and many long hitters have ruined their round getting too greedy.
